

## Distance to the edge matters know the zones of a roof

## **GENERAL DUTY PROVISIONS 29 CFR 1910.28**



RED ZONE (HIGHEST HAZARD)	DESIGNATED AREA / YELLOW ZONE (MEDIUM HAZARD)	GREEN ZONE (LOWEST HAZARD)
0 to 6 Feet from Edge	6 to 15 Feet from Edge	Greater than 15 Feet from Edge
All workers must wear conventional fall protection	Only for "infrequent and temporary" work, a designated area can be used with a warning line.	Only for "Infrequent and temporary" work
Acceptable fall protection includes:  OSHA compliant guardrail system  ANSI compliant personal fall arrest or travel restraint systems	<ul> <li>Warning line sag requirements:</li> <li>Breaking Strength of 200 lbs.</li> <li>≥ 34 in. but ≤ 39 in. from walking surface</li> <li>Visible from 25 ft.</li> <li>Stamped metal flagging every 6'</li> </ul> A monitoring system combined with a warning line requires:	Not required to provide any fall protection as long as:  • Employer implements, documents, and enforces a work rule prohibiting employees from going within 15' of edge without using fall protection
• 42-inch-high parapet	<ul> <li>Work monitored by a competent individual to ensure workers are within the designated area</li> </ul>	No requirements other than employees must remain at a distance greater than 15' from edge of roof.

## **OSHA Definitions:**

**Temporary**: Tasks that usually take less than 1-2 hours to complete.

Infrequent: Tasks performed at intervals (monthly/yearly) or as needed (equipment break down).

<u>Designated Area</u>: A space which has a perimeter barrier erected to warn employees when they approach an unprotected side or edge and serves also to designate an area where work may be performed without additional fall protection.
