

FLUORESCENT BULB AND BALLAST RECYCLING

Fluorescent lamps illuminate countless classrooms, laboratories, and building on campus. HID lamps (mercury-vapor-metal-halide and high-pressure sodium) are used for streetlights, floodlights, and shop lights. When broken these lamps release mercury and other metals that damage the environment

CAUTION: Broken Fluorescent lamps must be managed as hazardous waste.

The University manages used fluorescent lamps as universal waste. The Universal Waste Rule is designated to reduce regulatory management requirement. The University manages used rechargeable batteries as universal waste. The Universal Waste Rule promotes pollution prevention and waste minimization by encouraging the recycling of used lamps instead of less desirable methods of disposal such as land filling or incineration.
