# Use of Controlled Substances in Research

he United States Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) regulates the use of controlled substances to prevent diversion and abuse. EHRS provides guidance to assist researchers in understanding and meeting their obligations under the DEA's extensive requirements.

## **DEA Registration**

The Principal Investigator (PI) is responsible for registering with the DEA prior to start of research activities using DEA Controlled Substances. Registration Renewal is required for continued research activity.

### **Security and Storage**

As part of the registration process, security and storage locations must be pre-approved by the DEA before registration certification can be granted.

#### **Inventory and Recordkeeping**

Documents must be readily retrievable and available for audit. Records for <u>Schedule</u> I and II controlled substances must be kept separate from <u>Schedule</u> III-V.

#### **Purchases and Transfers**

Only PIs, with a current DEA registration, are authorized to purchase and/or transfer controlled substances to other registrants.. Clinical registrations should not be used to obtain controlled substances for use in research.

## **EHRS Training and Registration**

PIs must also be registered with EHRS by completing and submitting the EHRS Controlled Substances Registration Form. Also, the required Controlled Substances training can be completed via the EHRS Online Training System.

#### **DEA Audit Liaison**

EHRS should be present for DEA audits of researchers using controlled substances.

#### **Reporting Theft or Loss**

PIs must ensure that any shortages or misuse do not go unnoticed. Theft or loss must be reported immediately by filling out DEA's form 106 online and by contacting EHRS and Campus Safety.

#### **Disposals and Reverse Distribution**

DEA registrants are responsible for proper disposal of any controlled substances in their possession.
